Let's talk about blood cancer, let's **think about MDS**

September is Blood Cancer Awareness month

This **Blood Cancer Awareness Month**, the MDS Alliance is supporting the education and awareness of myelodysplastic syndromes, a rare group of blood cancers.

The MDS Alliance is running a 4-week campaign called **#ThinkMDS**:

This campaign raises awareness of blood cancer, and educating about MDS, a rare group of blood cancers. The focus is specifically for HCPs or caregivers to <u>notice the signs</u> and take next actions.

Week 1: Highlighting one of the signs – bruising

Week 2: Highlighting one of the signs – **fatigue**

Week 3: Highlighting one of the signs – **breathlessness**

Week 4: Highlighting one of the signs - weakness

Information on signs of MDS are underpinned by highlighting that a complete blood count (CBC) can determine if further investigation is required. A complete blood count test is one of the most common laboratory tests performed today, and as such is a globally inclusive message for the MDS Alliance to share.


